PRESENT TO SERVE THOSE IN NEED

Blessings To-Go

Focused on meeting the needs of the community, GYAC swiftly switched its twice monthly food bank into a mobile food pantry, providing fresh and non-perishable food and hygiene products to an average of **400 households per month**.

Back'pack'ed by the Community

Another pandemic pivot led GYAC to adopt a mobile version of its 22nd Annual Back to School Supply Giveaway and gift **850+ backpacks filled with supplies** for kids in need. Countless donors are to thank.

Turkey Share

Last Thanksgiving was an incredibly trying time - losses on so many levels pushing families to the brink. Our partnership with the Sheriff's Office persevered. Together we gifted **850+ turkeys** to local families - by far the most in 14 years!

Christmas a Go

Not every child receives a gift at Christmas. Thankfully, our community helps GYAC bring Christmas to both children and seniors. Over **100 GYAC students** received a present and **80 seniors** received a gift and home cooked meal.



LISTENING *FOR SOLUTIONS*

AFTERSCHOOL & SUMMER CAMP

Prior to the pandemic, 209 students were served in GYAC's afterschool program. Then, the Center shuttered its doors two months prior to the end of the 2019-2020 school year. Although we physically closed our doors, our program persevered. Teachers kept in close contact with parents and students alike, offering homework assistance and words of encouragement.

Transitioning to summer camp, GYAC was one of the first local organizations to open its doors to children, giving students a safe place to go so parents could get back to work. No field trips, but students remained healthy and active. They engaged in academics, STEAM experiments, outdoor activities and virtual field trips. Camp was even extended by a week due to a delayed start of school.



ADULTS & SENIORS

GYAC hit the pause button on many of Beyond Special K's (BSK) activities in March of 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This pause has not prevented us from carrying out our mission to serve adults and seniors in our community.

BSK coordinator, Theresa Baxter, has vigilantly kept in touch with our members and the community, connecting those in need with resources including food, toiletries, cleaning supplies, medical equipment and masks. She has also worked with community partners, Treasure Coast Food Bank and Shining Light Garden, to maintain a healthy supply of fresh and non-perishable foods for GYAC's twice monthly (mobile) food pantry.

COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

In many ways, the pandemic allowed GYAC to shine. Longstanding relationships and partnerships enabled GYAC to serve the community in ways we may not have discovered prior to the pandemic. Working with Treasure Coast Community Health, GYAC's Freddie Woolfork and Mary McKinney played a pivotal role in getting shots in arms for those with strained access to healthcare. GYAC also partnered with Indian River County to bring an outdoor movie night and a reimagined Easter outing to life. Plus, our twice monthly radio spots on WTTB's Local News Magazine with Bob Soos helped us spread the word about important resources, programs, events, and initiatives.

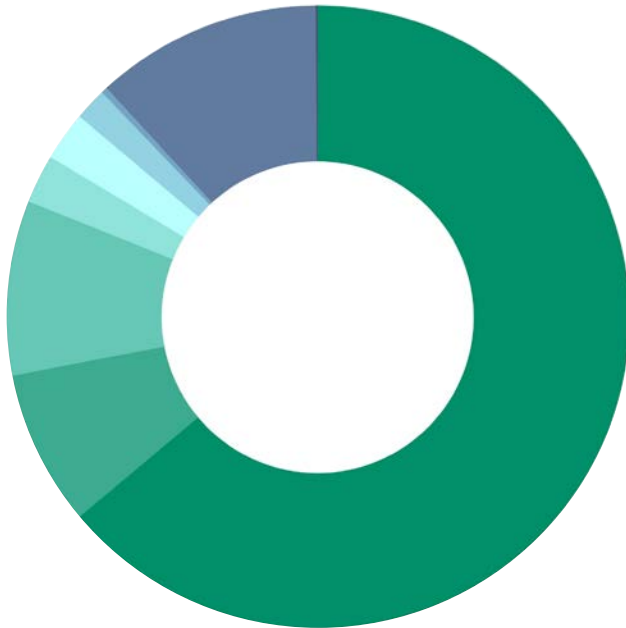

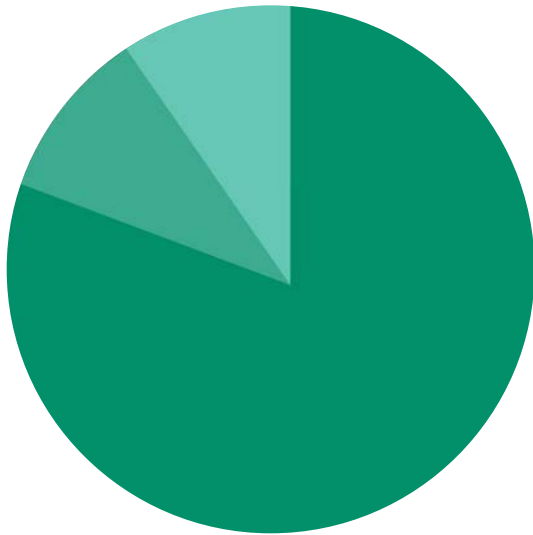

FINDING OUR CENTER

When Ja'Licia was a little girl, she traveled north from Miami each summer to visit her grandparents in a much smaller town called Vero Beach. It's there that she fondly remembers the place where she first fell in love with reading. That special place was the Gifford Youth Achievement Center.

"Dale Brown was my teacher, and we read a book a week," recalled Ja'Licia. "That summer I became obsessed with reading." So much so that in the first grade, Ja'Licia won her school's McDonald's reading scholarship by reading 215 books in six months!

Ja'Licia attributes her appreciation for language arts and the complexity of the English language to GYAC. "Being a Black child and proper in Miami, I was made fun of. But at GYAC, I was told I wasn't a nerd, I was smart." GYAC changed Ja'Licia's opinion about education and she later became the first person in the state of Florida to get a perfect score on the FCAT!

While she never considered permanently living in Indian River County, Ja'Licia came to the aid of her grandfather when he became ill. After he passed away, she stayed to care for her grandmother. A year later, she lost her grandmother. It was a tough time for Ja'Licia. She thought, "I love it here. I've always loved it here." So, in 2011, she decided to stay.

Then, life really hit hard. "I ended up getting really sick with cancer and was diagnosed with lupus." At age 16, Ja'Licia was told she would never have children.

But soon the impossible became possible. "Christian, my little miracle, that I was told I would never have, came into the world."

Fast-forward, Ja'Licia began looking into GYAC before Christian entered Kindergarten. He wasn't even eligible to attend, but Ja'Licia was passionate about him going to GYAC, so she paid for the entire year in advance.



"As a parent, I've always been concerned about the summer gap and loss of learning. GYAC challenges students to reach the next level during summer." Ja'Licia appreciates that GYAC is not a daycare and offers both tutoring and cultural experiences. Christian has participated in beach clean-ups, recycling, boat tours with the ELC, as well as field trips to the zoo, a farm, and the movies. Christian even learned to swim after being introduced to Float Hope, a GYAC partner organization that offers lessons at no cost.

"Christian is a little version of myself personified. Everywhere I go, people know me because of Christian. He's a ladies' man, musician and athlete."

"I didn't realize it growing up, but I was blessed to have a very diverse exposure to teachers." Ja'Licia wants the same for Christian. He needs a diverse group of teachers.

"I cannot speak enough about the support from GYAC. I'm a single parent, and it's hard. The homework help alone is huge. As a parent, I'm forever grateful."

Inspired by her own experiences, Ja'Licia works for Cleveland Clinic Indian River Hospital where she created a program to help patients prevent financial toxicity due to the cost of treatment. Last year, she was on target to help patients save \$15 million. Her specialty: oncology, dermatology, hematology, pulmonology, cardiology, infectious disease, and anything that requires financial assistance.

Unfortunately, last year, Christian experienced his own health issues. Complications with internal bleeding after a December 2019 surgery prevented Christian from attending school until two weeks before the shutdown. The first week back to school was tough.

"It was very difficult, emotionally, for him." Christian dealt with a lot of teasing at school, because he lost so much weight. After picking up Christian on one of his worst days, Christian reported, "Mommy, I had a rough day, but I got to GYAC and it was so much better." "GYAC is his safe haven," sighed Ja'Licia.

Getting Christian back to his pre-surgery weight was critical, so Mom spoke with Ms. Barbara, GYAC's Executive Assistant. Ms. Barbara said, "Say no more- I will sit with him until all of his food is gone." And Ms. Barbara kept her promise. She made sure Christian ate all of his food and then some, even if it took longer than the other kids.

For Christian, transitioning to online learning was a blessing, because he was very overwhelmed at school. After a while, the toll of school and GYAC being closed was emotionally breaking for a lot of parents. "When GYAC opened back up, it was a breath of fresh air," exclaimed Ja'Licia. Confined to his home and yard, Christian was ready to finally be around people again.

For a moment, due to his health, Christian was unsure about participating in regular activities, but "before we knew it, he was back to being himself," said Ja'Licia with a chuckle. His test scores were higher, and his swim times were faster.

"If you ask Christian what he wants to be when he grows up, he's going to tell you a doctor. He wants to be a surgeon, but he's doesn't know what type of surgeon yet." Mind you Christian is 7.

GYAC will see to it that Christian and all of our students are extended every opportunity to succeed so that every child whom we serve is equipped to pursue their dreams, whether it may be college, trade school, or landing their first job.

"It's truly a life-changing program. I can't wait to see him his senior year," said Ja'Licia. Neither can we, Ja'Licia. Neither can we!

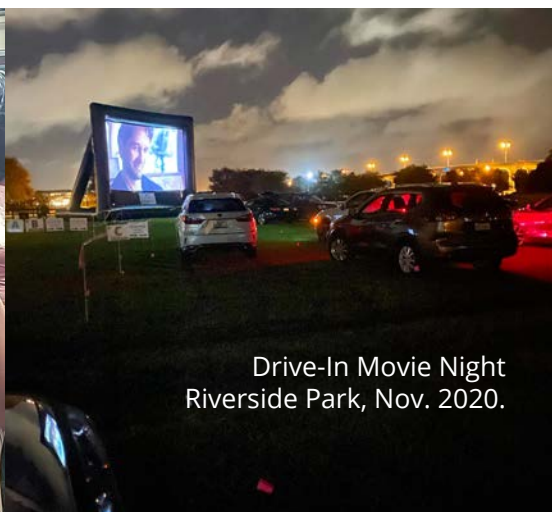

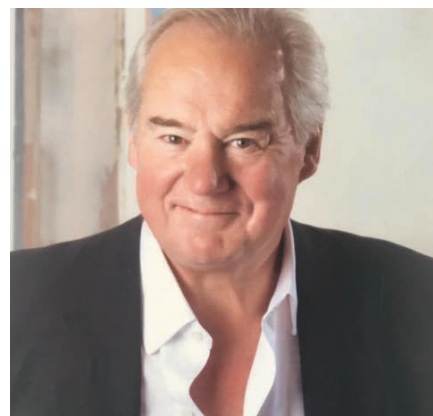

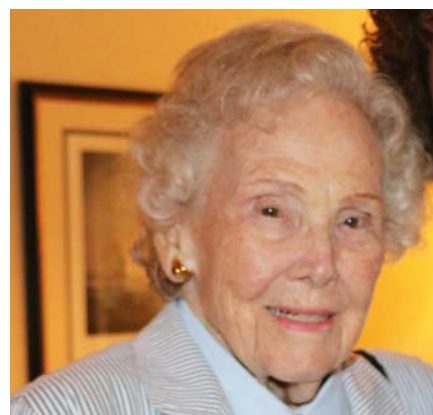
